

BSNM Fellowships

Two types of fellowships members can apply for:

1. BSNM Fellow
2. BSNM Associate Fellow

BSNM Fellow

Fellow status will be conferred to members in acknowledgment of their outstanding achievements and significant impact in the field of nanomedicine.

Eligibility requirements:

The nominated person must:

1. Be a current member of the BSNM (for at least 2 years)
2. Have earned a doctoral degree (M.D., Ph.D.) - a proven track record in nanomedicine, as demonstrated by at **least two of the areas** listed below:
 - Performed research in the field of nanomedicine evidenced by achievements in the field, including professional status, patents, intellectual property, translation, knowledge transfer or publications.
 - Able to demonstrate fundamental understanding and contribution to the development and/or translation of one or more devices/pharmaceuticals on the nanoscale for imaging, diagnostic or therapeutic purposes *in vitro* and/or *in vivo*.
 - Able to demonstrate fundamental understanding and contribution to the development and/or translation of new applications for existing nanoscaled medicine technology.
 - Able to demonstrate fundamental understanding and contribution to the development and/or translation of techniques for nanoscale imaging, diagnostic, sensing, or measurement.
 - Publication of articles directly relating to nanomedicine, as a principal investigator (lead author) or as a co-author in at least 10 high quality, peer-reviewed journals or an equivalent contribution for applicants working in industry.
 - Having successfully supervised/ currently supervising at least 3 PhD students in the field of nanomedicine (or the equivalent of an earned doctoral degree).

Nominations

- Candidates may self-nominate or be nominated by a member of the BSNM.
- Nominations can come from all clinical and scientific sectors involving nanomedicine

- Nominations must consist of a 1-page narrative CV as to why the nominee is eligible. A £100 non-refundable application fee must accompany all applications for Fellow.
- The membership of BSNM is diverse and global, and the Fellows of the BSNM should reflect that diversity. Fellowship nominations of women, members of underrepresented minority groups are equally welcome to apply.
- Fellows of the BSNM will be expected to actively contribute to and support the BSNM, the wider nanomedicine community and emerging nanomedicine scientists, with a direct input in the future running of the society.
- They will be inspirational by acting as a role model, and where appropriate a mentor, for the nanomedicine community. They will present their work at the BSNM conferences, play the role of models/mentors for younger researchers at the Early Career Researchers Meeting. The research of the Fellows will be described in the BSNM Newsletter.

Fellow Benefits

- If the nomination is successful, the Fellow will be informed by e-mail and will receive a certificate by post. The Fellow's name will appear on the BSNM website.
- This recognition could be used as part of the doctor's title (FBSNM).
- A nominal yearly fee of £50 will be requested for the maintenance of the fellowship.
- The Fellows will benefit from reduced costs for attending the BSNM Annual Meetings.

BSNM Associate Fellow

Associate Fellow status will be conferred to early-career members who have already showcased promising contributions to the field.

Eligibility requirements:

1. Have an MSc, MRes or equivalent diplomas
2. Are already demonstrated contribution in nanomedicine, as demonstrated by at **least two of the areas** listed below:
 - Demonstrable fundamental understanding and contribution to the development and/or translation of one or more devices/pharmaceuticals on the nanoscale for imaging or therapeutic purposes *in vitro* and *in vivo*.
 - Able to demonstrate a fundamental understanding and contribution to the development and/or translation of new applications for existing nanoscaled medicine technology.
 - Able to demonstrate a fundamental understanding and contribution to the development and/or translation of techniques for nanoscale imaging, sensing, or measurement.
 - Publication of at least 2 peer reviewed articles directly relating to nanomedicine, in peer-reviewed journals or an equivalent contribution for applicants working in industry.

Nominations

- Candidates can be nominated by a member of the BSNM.
- Nominations must consist of a 1-page narrative CV as to why the nominee is eligible. A £100 non-refundable application fee must accompany all applications for Associate Fellow.
- The membership of BSNM is diverse and global, and the Associate Fellows of the BSNM should reflect that diversity. Associate Fellowship nominations of women, members of underrepresented minority groups, and scientists from outside the United Kingdom are especially encouraged.
- Associate Fellows of the BSNM will be expected to actively contribute to and support the BSNM, the wider nanomedicine community and emerging nanomedicine scientists.
- They will present their work at the BSNM conferences. The research of the Fellows will be described in the BSNM Newsletter.
- 2 BSNM Associate Fellowships will be awarded each year.

Fellow Benefits

- If the nomination is successful, the Associate Fellow will be informed by e-mail and will receive a certificate by post. The Associate Fellow's name will appear on the BSNM website.
- This recognition could be used as part of the doctor's title (AFBSN).
- A nominal yearly fee of £25 will be requested for the maintenance of the Associate Fellowship.
